



Medication/Health Policies

In accordance with the State of New Jersey's education statutes, LCCS maintains the following policies regarding medication at school:

If your student will be absent or late due to any medical reason

Please email their teacher, Nurse Monya (mmccarty@lccsnj.org) and the Office Manager, Leslie Urteaga (lurteaga@lccsnj.org)

Please also email Nurse Monya to inform her if your child is being treated for any ongoing medical issues

Most Medication for school requires a doctor's note

Sometimes referred to as a "doctor's order," this is legal requirement.

The best approach for any student health matter is to call or email the school nurse.

This is the person who will be caring for your child medically.

Teachers DO NOT administer medication and will send all ill/injured students to the School Health Office.

If your child needs medication during school hours:

Do not put your child or his/her classmates at risk by sending medication to school with your student. Call the school nurse and give the medication directly to your child's teacher, the school nurse, or the main office personnel.

If your child has a condition requiring medication to be given and stored at school

Please contact the school nurse to create a school health care plan in accordance with you, your child and his/her doctor.

It is LCCS's policy to contact a parent when a child is ill, particularly if there is fever, vomiting, or severe malaise ("feeling bad") – or if there is an injury.
